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Introduction

Background

In 1990, the PATH (People Assessing Their Health) project was created as the outcome of a partnership between the Antigonish Women's Resource Centre, Public Healthcare services and the Extension Department of St. Francis-Xavier University.

The PATH project for Acadians and francophones in Richmond County and Pomquet was conducted between January and June 2010 through a partnership between the Guysborough Antigonish Strait Health Authority (GASHA) and Réseau Santé Nouvelle-Écosse, with additional financial support from Health Canada through the Société Santé en français.

Through the participation of Acadians and francophones from the Richmond and Pomquet areas, the project led to creation of a tool for assessing the status of community health, known as CHIAT (Community Health Impact Assessment Tool), which identifies the key social determinants that affect people's health. The project also encourages Acadians and francophones to participate more actively in future consultations and to become involved in decision making about their health.

What is the purpose of this tool?

The Community Health Impact Assessment Tool (CHIAT):

- Assesses the positive or negative effects of policy activities, programs or services that affect the health of Acadians and francophones in Richmond County and Pomquet;
- Identifies the areas where additional information is required;
- Identifies the actions required to ensure that proposals make a positive contribution to the needs of Acadians and francophones.

The vision for our Acadian community

Empower a harmonious, vibrant Acadian community, consisting of diverse age groups living in a healthy and safe environment, in which citizens are supported by a flourishing economy, a church that meets parishioners' needs, and an education that fosters the development of its people.

The Lighthouse

Each component of the lighthouse represents:

The Stairs – Represent life stages: young people, adults and seniors.


The Batteries – Represent community involvement and leadership.

Planning the process.

- Decide on the key people to invite to this session.

• Facilitate the process.

- Explain the purpose and objectives of this session to participants.
- Review Health Canada's determinants of health.

Use the tool.

- Review how each proposal influences the determinants of health for Acadians/francophones.
- Check (**✓**) if the impact has a positive, negative, or unknown impact, or does not apply (N/A).
- Add your comments, suggestions, etc.
- Don't forget our community's strength: principles.

Data and actions to take

- Summarize the data.
- Include more detailed information.
- Draft the action plan.

Note:

- The determinants of health presented in this tool are not necessarily shown in order of priority.
- It is very important that Acadians/francophones from the community be involved in this process to ensure that their needs are addressed and met to ensure success.

Culture
